What is the Hope Air Volunteer Pilot Program ("VPP")?

VPP provides general aviation pilots with the opportunity to combine their passion for flying with their desire to help people in need.

Volunteer pilots donate their time and flying skills to provide air transportation for Canadians in financial need seeking medical treatment outside their home community.

Are there benefits when flying a Mission as a Hope Air Volunteer Pilot?

The biggest benefits are the "smiles of thanks" you will get when helping someone in need! VPP Pilots also receive:

- fuel reimbursement (at a preset rate) for your flying time
- a charitable tax receipt for your related operating costs
- permission to use the Hope Air call sign which waives airport landing and NavCanada fees
- participation in VPP Pilot recognition events
- additional liability insurance coverage at no cost to you

The biggest benefit is the opportunity to combine your passion for flying with the reward of helping someone in need!

Who can become a Hope Air Volunteer Pilot?

Any pilot who meets the following minimum qualifications:

1. Private Pilot Licence with 200 hours PIC, or
2. Commercial Pilot Licence.

And 30 hours on type in either case.
